Following the successful completion of the Year 12 Gold Expedition in the summer we are pleased to be celebrating yet more Gold success this term. Eight students have now completed all five sections of their Gold Award and we are awaiting confirmation of their celebration presentations. Buckingham Palace here we come!

Bronze DofE 2022-23 cohort complete their final expedition

In September, 36 intrepid Year 10s completed their final Bronze expedition. Seven expedition teams journeyed from Bishop Wilton village to Shiptonthorpe (or vice versa), via Allerthorpe Lakeland Park campsite. Supervisors and assessors were very impressed by the teams' determination and teamwork, in sunshine and rain! Students talked about their sense of achievement on completing their expedition having walked so far, navigating their routes and carrying their kit. They have clearly grown in confidence and resilience, as well as developing their practical skills and campcraft.

Students are now focusing on completing the other sections of the Bronze DofE in order to gain the full award: Volunteering, Skills and Physical. We are delighted that many are already setting their sights on the Silver award, which will be undertaken in collaboration with Beverley Grammar School. Whole School Photo



Heritage Open Day 2023



We opened our doors for National Heritage Open Day on Friday, 8 September. It was lovely to welcome back some former students of the school as well as other interested parties who browsed the artefacts on display in the school hall, and toured the admin building. There were many kind words from appreciative visitors about our students and the school. Thank you to our Heads of House, Hannah, Natalia, Lily, Alice and Grace, who were fantastic ambassadors for our school.

Year 7 CATs

All of Year 7 have taken part in the CATs (Cognitive Ability Tests). Students took a range of computerised tests under the headings verbal, spatial, non-verbal and quantitative. The tests are used as a diagnostic tool by staff to identify strengths and weaknesses of individuals in word comprehension, number patterns and spatial patterns. They are also helpful for the school to understand the current ability profile of the whole cohort. Although we do not share the outcomes of these assessments, due to the specialist knowledge required, we do use them to provide pupils with a baseline ability level. This will be displayed on the three annual reports as a comparison to help you make sense of your child's progress. Please remember that this is based on assessments on one day, they do not label your child or prevent them accessing the full range of the curriculum. This level will remain unchanged throughout Key Stage 3. The reports each year have indications of the sort of outcomes expected by a pupil with the same starting point but individuals may be above or below this in one or more areas in a subject or across all their subjects.

Year 7 as a year group handled the assessments extremely well. They were organised, on time and there was minimal fuss. It was a very mature approach: few people relish lengthy assessments. The information that the tests provide are particularly useful for identifying additional need and access arrangements but for the majority of pupils they will be of little personal consequence. Rest assured though that they are very helpful in the background. Well done Year 7!





Music Matters

Ensembles, Choirs and Concerts

Rehearsal of all our instrumental and singing groups are taking place as per the schedule. We encourage all of our young musicians to take part in at least one ensemble or choir and to take part in at least one of the concerts. These groups are open to pupils who learn instruments in school and with privately and pupils are welcome to join at any time.

Instrumental Lessons

Instrumental lessons are going strong with lots of Y7 pupils continuing form primary school and others who have taken up an instrument as a new starter. Our ten visiting instrumental teachers from the East Riding Schools Music Service offer the full range of instruments and there are still a few spaces available, particularly for oboe, bassoon, cello, double bass, trumpet, horn, trombone and tuba. **The letter about starting an instrument scan be found on our website in Curriculum – Subjects – Music**. This month's Journal marked International Literacy Day on 8th September. Thank you to all the students who contributed to this fascinating edition.








Art Department Website








Tutor Reading Book of the Month: We Should All Be Feminists by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie

Students in Year 11 have the opportunity to read We Should All Be Feminists by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie as part of the tutor reading programme. Taken from her globally influential TED talk, this is Ngozi Adichie's feminist manifesto. A powerful, personal essay of hope and ambition for a better, fairer world. This is a personal and powerful essay from Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, the bestselling author Americanah and Half of a Yellow Sun.

'I would like to ask that we begin to dream about and plan for a different world. A fairer world. A world of happier men and happier women who are truer to themselves. And this is how to start: we must raise our daughters differently. We must also raise our sons differently...'

She asks, what does 'Feminism' mean today?



In this personal, eloquently argued essay, adapted from her much-admired TEDx talk of the same name, - Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie offers readers a unique definition of Feminism for the twenty-first century, one rooted in inclusion and awareness.

Drawing extensively on her own experiences and her deep understanding of the often masked realities of sexual politics, here is one remarkable author's exploration of what it means to be a woman now - an of-the-moment rallying cry for why we should all be feminists.
