Beverley Minster Christmas Tree Festival

This month the school participated in the annual Beverley Minster Christmas Tree Festival, where there are up to 125 Christmas trees on display. Each tree is sponsored by a different local charity, organisation, school or business and decorated as they wish. Once dressed, the trees are then open to the public and a competition takes place to vote for the best tree.

A lunch club took place throughout November which allowed students in all year groups to create a decoration to go on the tree, this year the theme was Christmas Stockings. This resulted in over 90 decorations being hand made in a

variety of media such as paper, wood and fabric. Thank you to everyone who came to the Christmas club and made a Christmas decoration, they looked absolutely fantastic! The students who attended the club then had the opportunity to be placed in a random draw to select three students to go and decorate the tree.

On Thursday 30th November, Darcy from Year 7, Izzy from Year 8 and Jasmine from Year 9 took a trip to Beverley Minster to place the decorations on the Beverley High School tree. It was a chilly day with frost on the ground - very fitting for decorating a Christmas tree! The students had a wonderful morning at the Minster with a chance to get a sneak peak at the other trees on display before the event was opened up to the public. It was a rewarding experience for the students which allowed them to interact with the wider community and support local businesses. The pupils loved the opportunity to watch and listen to a live performance of well-loved tunes in the beautiful Hull City Hall which also featured a surprise guest-star appearance from an owl on stage! We even got to participate in the performance of 'This Is Halloween' from 'The Nightmare Before Christmas'!

The 'Music, Magic and Mystery' concert was an inspiring experience for our pupils, not only because of the excellent quality of the repertoire and the musicians' performance but because this was the first time, in the orchestra's over 130 years of existence, that the Hull Philharmonic was led by a female conductor! What an empowering moment for all our young musicians at Beverley High School!

Staff from both institutions commented on how impressed they were with the students' maturity and the range of questions they posed; well done Year 11.





University of Hull Law Conference

On the 13th of December ten J6th students who have expressed an interest in a career in Law attended the Annual Sixth Form Law Conference at the University of Hull. His Honour, Judge Bury was the guest speaker, he captured all of our attention when he gave us an insight into prosecution and defence over the years. Judge Bury also talked about the impact of technology on crime, the positives and the negatives, and what the future may bring with the addition of Artificial Intelligence. Dr Caroline Gibby, a Head of the Law School, gave a very informative session in one of the university court rooms on the benefits of doing a Law degree, and how it opens doors into many professions, not just Law. It was a great opportunity for students to experience life on campus and get an insight into the legal profession.





Year 10 Geographers attend World Food Programme Talk

Year 10 Geographers enjoyed an online talk on Wednesday 13th December from Margaret Beatham about her work procuring food for the World Food Programme. Just back from emergency work in Gaza she gave students an insight into the scale of the work that the WFP undertakes (helping over 193 million people suffering from acute hunger) and the difficulties of getting food into some of the world's most challenging locations. It gave students and staff a huge amount to think about, and Margaret was also kind enough to talk about future career opportunities with the WFP.

Tutor Reading Book of the Month: The Woman in Black by Susan Hill

Students in Years 9 and 10 have the opportunity to read *The Woman in Black* by Susan Hill as part of the tutor reading programme.

Arthur Kipps, a junior solicitor, is summoned to attend the funeral of Mrs Alice Drablow, the house's sole inhabitant of Eel Marsh House, unaware of the tragic secrets which lie hidden behind the shuttered windows.

The house stands at the end of a causeway, wreathed in fog and mystery, but it is not until he glimpses a wasted young woman, dressed all in black, at the funeral, that a creeping sense of unease begins to take hold, a feeling deepened by the reluctance of the locals to talk of the woman in black - and her terrible purpose.

Yorkshire-born writer Susan Hill's writing career has been as wide-ranging as it has been phenomenally successful, encompassing literary fiction, crime novels, plays, ghost stories, children's books and memoirs.

As well as being one of the world's bestselling novelists, her work has attracted extensive critical acclaim having won the Whitbread, Somerset Maugham and John Llewelyn Rhys awards, as well as having been shortlisted for the Booker Prize.

Here is an excerpt from the first chapter, 'Christmas Eve:'


It was nine-thirty on Christmas Eve. As I crossed the long entrance hall of Monk's Piece on my way from the dining room, where we had just enjoyed the first of the happy, festive meals, toward the drawing room and the fire around which my family were now assembled, I paused and then, as I often do in the course of an evening, went to the front door, opened it and stepped outside.

I have always liked to take a breath of the evening, to smell the air, whether it is sweetly scented and balmy with the flowers of midsummer, pungent with the bonfires and leaf-mould of autumn, or crackling cold from frost and snow. I like to look about me at the sky above my head, whether there are moon and stars or utter blackness, and into the darkness ahead of me; I like to listen for the cries of nocturnal creatures and the moaning rise and fall of the wind, or the pattering of rain in the orchard trees, I enjoy the rush of air toward me up the hill from the flat pastures of the river valley. Tonight, I smelled at once, and with a lightening heart, that there had been a change in the weather. All the previous week, we had had rain, chilling rain and a mist that lay low about the house and over the countryside.




Amazing Art

































Creative Cubes


