What a great way to end the year!





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
Tutor Reading Book of the Month: The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank

Students in Years 9 and 10 have the opportunity to read The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank as part of the tutor reading programme. We have chosen this book for this issue of Beverley Highlife to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day.

One of the most famous accounts of living under the Nazi regime of World War II comes from the diary of a thirteen-year-old Jewish girl, Anne Frank. Today, The Diary of a Young Girl has sold over 25 million copies world-wide.

"12 June 1942: I hope I will be able to confide everything to you, as I have never been able to confide in anyone, and I hope you will be a great source of comfort and support."

The Diary of a Young Girl is one of the most celebrated and enduring books of the last century. Tens of millions have read it since it was first published in 1947 and it remains a deeply admired testament to the indestructible nature of the human spirit.



Anne Frank and her family fled the horrors of Nazi occupation by hiding in the back of a warehouse in Amsterdam for two years with another family and a German dentist. Aged thirteen when she went into the secret annexe, Anne kept a diary. She movingly revealed how the eight people living under these extraordinary conditions coped with hunger, the daily threat of discovery and death and being cut off from the outside world, as well as petty misunderstandings and the unbearable strain of living like prisoners.

The Diary of a Young Girl is a timeless true story to be rediscovered by each new generation. For young readers and adults, it continues to bring to life Anne's extraordinary courage and struggle throughout her ordeal.

What did you study? GCSE – Triple Science, PE, Geography, Food Tech plus the standard GCSEs; AS Level – Maths, A Level – Biology, Chemistry, Geography; University – BSc(Hons) Human Biology and MSc(Res) Biomedical Science



A few details about your profession/daily work

I currently work at Reckitt in Hull, which is well known for its brands such as Dettol, Gaviscon, Veet, Finish and so many more. I first started at Reckitt working in the R&D Microbiology labs ensuring that products both consumed orally and applied topically to the skin did not contain any harmful bacteria and were unable to provide a perfect home for bacteria to grow, during this time I supported numerous global brands including E45, Scholl, Dettol, Lemsip, Veet, Gaviscon etc.

After 18 months in the labs I moved over to the Global Medical Affairs team, specifically our Germ Protection & Healthy Skin team. Our team looks after all the human related safety and efficacy data for Dettol and Veet globally, this involves working collaboratively with numerous teams including Consumer Safety, R&D, Legal and Regulatory in order to deliver brand new products to shelves around the world that both work as they say they do but are also fit for purpose in terms of their safety profile. A large part of the Medical input into these projects is the designing of clinical studies and the subsequent analysis of the data that comes back. I'm into my 3rd year in Global Medical Affairs and I still absolutely LOVE IT!
