Design and Technology Achievement



Massive congratulations to Lettie S and Lily C who applied for and successfully got through a rigorous selection process to become two of only 14 pupils selected from the whole country to take part in a week's work experience at BAe Systems in Brough.

BAe devised a comprehensive programme of construction challenges, coding, communication and team building tasks. They were introduced to a range of staff with diverse roles who explained their pathway into the company and the skills they use. Their final task was to create a presentation to engineers and company management.

Lettie and Lily were only two of four females in the group of fourteen and with only around 16.5% of engineers being women we are hoping that they are inspired by this experience to pursue a career in STEM and help to redress the gender imbalance.

Silver Duke of Edinburgh Expedition

On Thursday 10th July, 30 Year 10 students began their final Silver Duke of Edinburgh expedition. This was a joint expedition run alongside students from Beverley Grammar School, in which students were assessed to see if they could pass this section of the Award. The students walked for three days in total and camped for two nights, starting in Helmsley and finishing in Osmotherley. The temperature was particularly high which meant it was even more challenging, the students behaved impeccably throughout, they demonstrated great resilience and teamwork. Staff members received a multitude of compliments from members of the public about how considerate and friendly the students were. One team in particular handled a situation with the calmness and speed that we would expect from a Gold expedition, well done to all involved. All teams have successfully passed this section of the Award, the students should feel very proud of their accomplishments.

Beverley High School Students Inspired by Visit to East Riding College Campus

BEVERLEY, 11 July 2025 – A group of 35 eager Year 10 students from Beverley High School were welcomed to East Riding College’s Beverley campus for a hands-on introduction to further education and career pathways.

Located in the heart of the Flemingate development, campus opened its doors for a full tour, offering the students a chance to explore the impressive facilities and sample the wide range of courses on offer.

The visit began with a warm welcome followed by staff guiding students through specialist teaching areas, including motor vehicle workshops, hair and beauty salons, and dedicated catering kitchens.

The tour introduced students to a diverse selection of subjects available at the college, including motor mechanics, joinery, bricklaying, hair and beauty, food and catering, textiles, early years education, health and social care, travel and tourism, and even routes into medicine through healthcare-focused pathways.

One of the highlights for many students was visiting *Inspire*, the college’s commercial hair and beauty salon, and *Elwell’s Restaurant*, where catering and hospitality students serve real customers in a professional kitchen and dining setting. These experiences allowed the pupils to see first-hand how learning at East Riding College blends theory with practice.



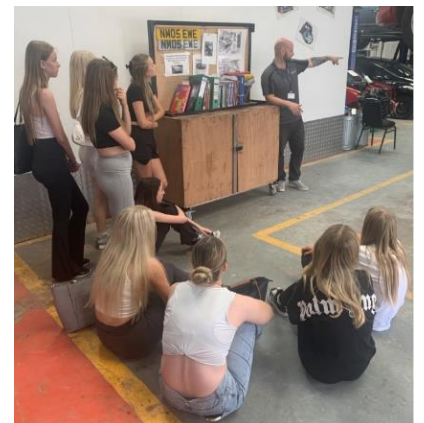
A stop at the motor vehicle workshop offered insight into practical skills training in mechanics, while visits to classrooms showcasing early years and health and social care tracks sparked conversations about future university and career options.



For many of the Year 10 students, this visit marked their first exposure to vocational and technical education beyond school. “The range of courses and the facilities really opened our eyes to what’s possible after Year 11,” said one student.

The college’s staff were on hand throughout the visit to answer questions, provide careers advice, and explain the support available to

students—from transport options and financial help to enrichment activities and industry placements.

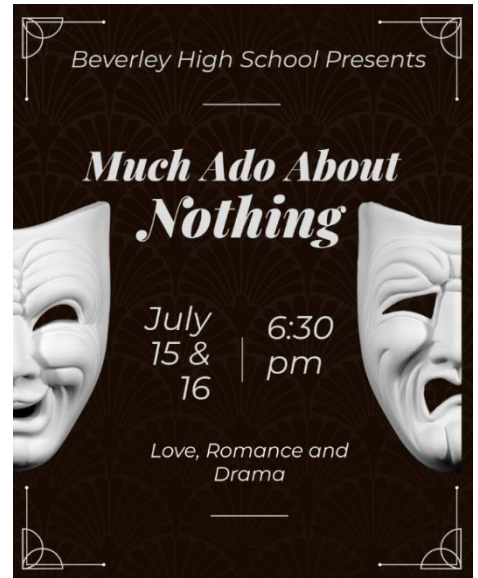

Eurofest at Hymers College



Twenty Year 8 pupils won the opportunity to represent BHS at Hymers in July – competing in a trade environment, with stalls displaying goods and products, or offering information about a region of France/Germany. Five local schools took part, including Hymers and BHS. Our German and French students did a brilliant job of explaining their products/area in the target language, there was a fantastic buzz whilst the judges circulated asking the pupils questions and listening intently to the responses: all in French or German!

One of our German teams won the award for Best Use of German, and one of our French teams won a special award for the amount of effort that went into their stall and products. All students represented Beverley High School with pride, and were treated to a guest speaker in the afternoon – Dr John Kittmer, former British Diplomat as the Queen’s Ambassador to Greece – who highlighted the positive impact that speaking foreign languages has had on his professional journey, including working in the Cabinet Office, working as a First Secretary in Brussels, with the UN and DEFRA, and he shared some of the many experiences that speaking French and Ancient/Modern Greek plus German and Russian has enabled him to enjoy, including the chance to fly in a Red Arrows plane!

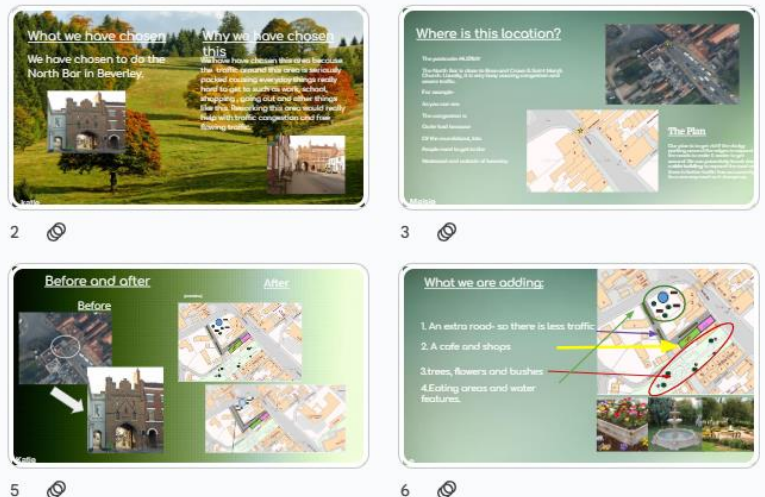

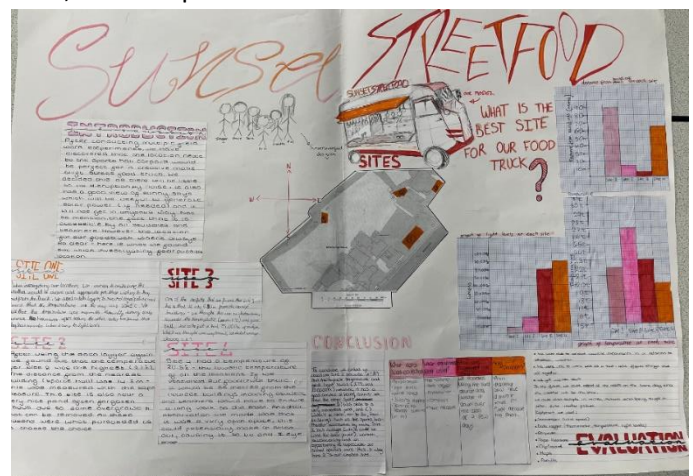

Year 8 Explore Microclimates to Design a School Café

Our Year 8 geographers have been investigating the concept of microclimate and learning how to use fieldwork equipment such as digital thermometers, lux meters, anemometers, and compasses.

Their challenge: to find the ideal location for a new school dining facility. The brief asked them to consider key factors — plenty of natural daylight to reduce the need for artificial lighting, a location close enough to existing buildings for convenience but far enough to minimise noise disruption, and a south-facing aspect to make the most of winter sun.

Students used the equipment with great accuracy and demonstrated impressive analytical thinking as they assessed multiple potential sites. After careful consideration, each group chose their preferred location and created thoughtful café designs. One of the standout projects is shared here:



Fairtrade

Having helped to achieve the 'Fairaware School' Fairtrade award, the Fairtrade committee has been busy continuing to build whole-school awareness and raising money.

Last week, the committee gave an assembly to Year 8. As part of this, they discussed in detail what Fairtrade is, its history and how it makes a difference. They should all be very proud of the confidence that they showed when presenting to their peers and of the research and thought that they put into their presentation.



The assembly was followed by a bake-sale this week, which sold cakes, buns and cookies largely made using Fairtrade products. We are pleased to say that we managed to raise £31.67 for Fairtrade through this and we hope to hold further events in the next academic year. Many thanks to all of the students who contributed baking towards this and/or bought from the stall.

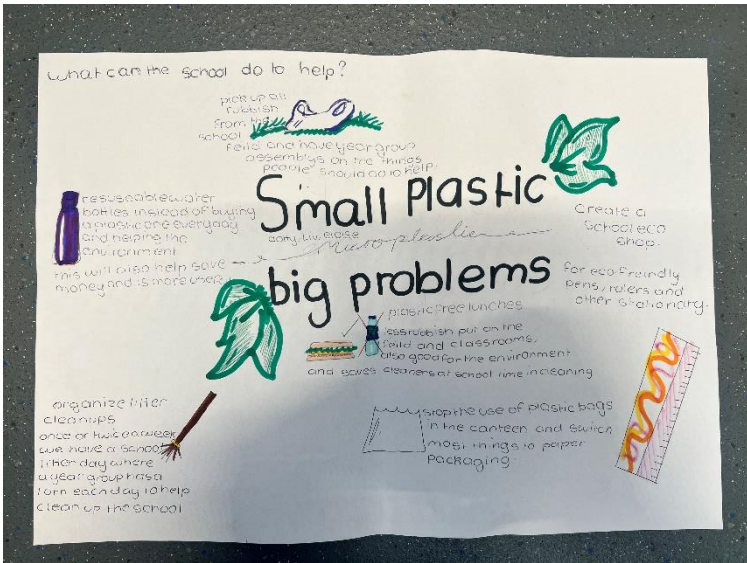
Eco Week

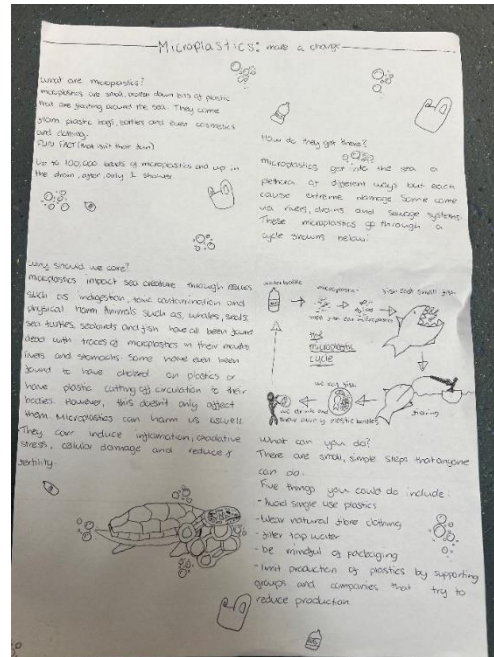
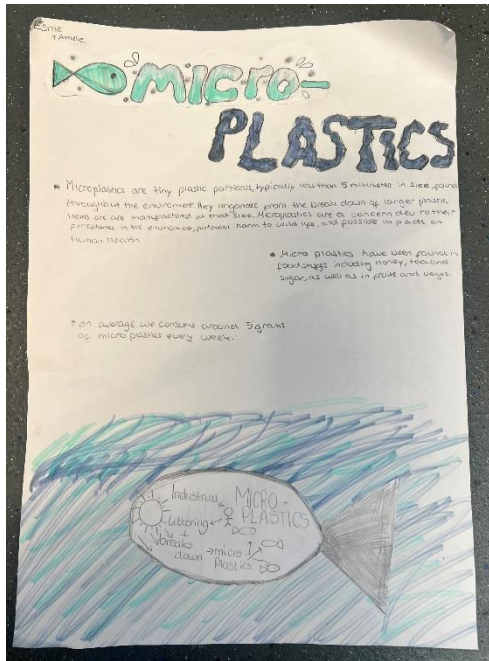
As part of this year's *Eco Week*, the Science Department worked with Year 8 students to raise awareness of a growing environmental concern: microplastics. Throughout the week, students explored where microplastics come from, how they enter ecosystems, and the impact they have on wildlife and human health.

Using a variety of digital resources, articles, and videos, students carried out independent research to understand the scale of the problem. They investigated sources such as synthetic clothing, cosmetic products, and packaging, and uncovered how these tiny plastics are ending up in our oceans, our food, and even our bodies.

The week culminated in students designing powerful posters and campaigns aimed at educating others about microplastics and encouraging more sustainable choices. Some groups went a step further and created action plans to promote change, suggesting ideas such as school-wide awareness days, plastic-free initiatives, and even contacting local businesses or MPs.

Year 8 approached the task with great enthusiasm and maturity, showing a genuine passion for protecting the environment. It was fantastic to see them think critically, collaborate, and take steps toward making a real difference. Well done, Year 8, eco warriors in the making!

On Friday 11th July, family, friends, and colleagues of Sarah Jeffery came together to run the hilly Walkington 10K in her loving memory. It was a warm summer evening, but our hearts were full as we remembered an amazing woman who is missed deeply every single day.


We ran to raise money for Menopause Support, a charity close to our hearts after Sarah tragically lost her battle with menopause and its associated symptoms. This vital organisation provides one-to-one support for women struggling with menopause, offers education and training packages, and most importantly, lobbies the government to make menopause awareness training mandatory for GPs and health workers. 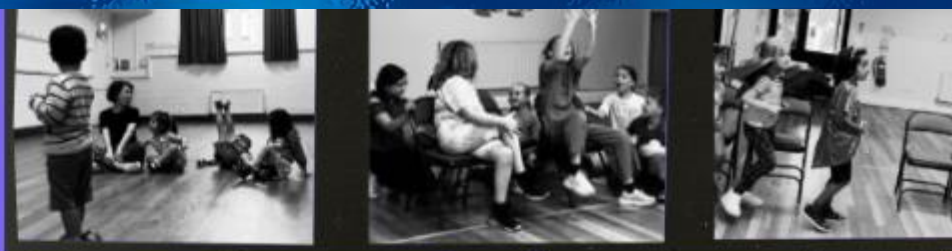
