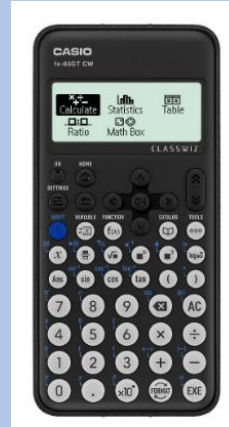
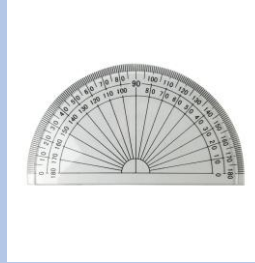
- Please mark your child's **uniform, PE kit and school bag** with **their name**
- Your child will be allocated their own locker – please encourage them to use it. They will need a **small padlock (3x3cm) with a key**. **Please keep a spare key safe at home!**
- Pupils should check the **lost property boxes** at the school office AND the sports hall if they lose any items
- The Headteacher and staff cannot be responsible for losses, so **please do not bring valuables** into school

Equipment packs are available to buy for £4 on the ParentPay app.

Please check if your child is eligible for a free pack and calculator. Pupils can collect them from Mrs Burniston's office in September.

The recommended calculator is a **Casio fx-83GT CW**. The School is able to offer the **Casio fx-83GT CW** for purchase at a much lower price than is normal in shops. The calculator is available to purchase on the ParentPay app at a cost of £9.00, for collection in September.

Both you and your child can download the **EduLink app** to view their weekly timetable and see what homework has been set.

Login details for EduLink are emailed out by our office in September, and will not be available before then.

- We will give pupils an **IT induction** in September, which will cover essentials such as **account security**, plus how to use their **school email** and **OneDrive**.
- Your child should **check their school email regularly**, especially if they have **instrumental lessons with the East Riding Music Service** as this is the way their music teacher will contact them.
- We also encourage them to use **OneDrive** to save schoolwork, so they can access it both at home and school.



What if my child feels unwell at school?

Your child can visit the school office to see our HealthCare Adviser and first aiders, at social times and during lessons (with permission from their teacher).



If your child is feeling worried or anxious rather than ill, they should speak to the HOY team or a member of Wellbeing staff to get support in school.

If your child needs to go home, rather than make arrangements themselves, **they must tell the school office** who will contact parents/carers.

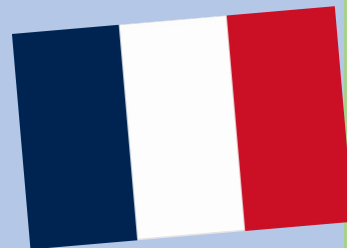

- If you download the **EduLink app**, you can view your child's **Achievement Points**, awarded by teachers for a variety of reasons including **Excellent Effort** and **Outstanding Work**. You will also be able to view teachers' comments.
- Teachers may choose to **ring or email home**, or your child may receive a **postcard** in the post.
- **Academic reports** are issued twice a year. Reports will give an **Attitude to Learning grade** and a **descriptive indication of progress** for each subject your child studies.
- Subject teachers are available to discuss your child's academic progress at **Parents Evening (online)** later in the year.

If you have concerns about your child's academic progress, please contact the relevant **Head of Department** or alternatively **Ms L. Watkins** (Head of Year).

Our monthly e-newsletter **Beverley Highlife** also gives updates on the many **extracurricular and enrichment opportunities** enjoyed by pupils, from school trips to individual pupil achievements.

How does the School House system work?

Pupils are assigned to one of five mixed ability form groups, each linked to one of the five Houses.

The five Houses are like their own families within the wider school community, and compete for the **House Cup** every year.

Inter-house competitions take place throughout the year, so that pupils from different year groups work together in

Through PSHE, our students will...

- Develop their knowledge in a wide range of topics.
- Learn how to keep themselves healthy and safe, physically and emotionally.

How is PSHE delivered at Beverley High?

- Pupils have one **double-lesson** of PSHE every 4 weeks (there are nine sessions scheduled for 2025/6).
- Lessons are usually delivered by pupils' **form tutor or a subject specialist** in that particular topic.
- Pupils have their own **PSHE folder** which will travel with them through Years 7-11.
- Our **bespoke PSHE curriculum** is: comprehensive; age-appropriate; **responsive** to emerging needs; fully **compliant** with statutory guidance on PSHE/RSE; devised in accordance with **best practice**, as determined by the PSHE Association.

Year 7 PSHE Curriculum:

1. Bodily autonomy
2. Healthy friendships and bullying
3. Diversity and equality
4. Being successful in school
5. Online safety: data and digital footprint
6. Health and wellbeing for life (sleep, nutrition and movement)
7. Planning for the future: ambitions and aspirations
8. Growing up: puberty changes and life with periods

TOPS Navy school sweatshirt (available from Price & Buckland). White or dark navy polo shirt.

SHOES Flat black leather or PVC. No canvas, soft fabric or boots. *No logo or markings.*

For Health and Safety, **pupils must not wear crocs or shoes with no backs**. This is due to pupils moving around the school for lessons and using stairs.

JEWELLERY etc. 1 pair of stud earrings or small hoops, 1 ring and 1 watch. *No bracelets. No valuable jewellery. No facial or oral piercings* e.g. nose or tongue studs. *No sunglasses.*



SKIRT/ TROUSERS – pleated navy school skirt which should be worn no more than 3 inches above the knee or navy trousers.

Alternatives are available from Marks and Spencers, Next, Asda and John Lewis. See Parents Evening information booklet.

COAT Appropriate for school and weather conditions. *No hoodies.*

SOCKS/TIGHTS Plain white, navy or black socks or navy / black tights.

HAIR/MAKE-UP/NAILS No flamboyant hair accessories, extreme styles or *unnatural hair colours*. Hair accessories need to be plain white or blue. Discreet make-up only e.g. subtle concealer. **NAILS SHOULD BE SHORT** for health and safety. *No coloured nail varnish.*

What is the school's mobile phone policy?

Mobile phones must be switched off and in a bag at all times whilst on school site



If a pupil does not follow the policy, **their phone will be confiscated by a member of staff** and stored in the **main office** for collection at the end of the day. You will be informed if this happens, and if it is a repeated occurrence you may be asked to collect the phone instead.

- If your child is absent from school, **please phone or text the school office (or use EduLink)** on the first day of absence, letting us know the reason for absence and the likely date of return.
- Pupils are expected to be **proactive** in catching up on lessons that they have missed, by speaking to their classmates or their teacher.

Please contact the school office if your child needs to leave during the day for an appointment. They will need to sign out and back in again at the school office.

Medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside school hours or during school holidays wherever possible

We do not authorise holidays in term time, in line with the Local Authority's policies
