- Failure to maintain the high standards and expectations that Beverley High School has could affect my position on future school visits.


Map for Careers fair 2016

Advice for the Careers fair

Good examples of questions to ask employers are:

- What are the different routes into your company?
- What qualifications would I need to get to join you?
- Is there anything else I need to be doing now to improve my chances of getting a job with you in the future?
- What job roles are available in your company?
- What kinds of skills and experience do you look for in the employees you hire?
- What are the characteristics of your most successful employees?
- How much could I earn working for your company?
- What route did you take to joining the company?
- What is a typical day like working for your company?
- What's the best thing about working for your company?
- What made you choose this company and why do you stay?

Good examples of questions to ask colleges, universities and apprenticeship providers are:

- What qualifications would I need to get to join you?
- Is there anything else I need to be doing now to improve my chances of joining you in the future?
- What could I go on to after I finished the course with you?
- What links do you have with businesses?
- What proportion of young people get jobs after leaving you?

Remember to be enthusiastic and polite — you never know, you might be speaking to someone who could interview you for a job one day!
