will aim to:

- provide a curriculum that is relevant and allows for progression
- provide teaching and learning experiences appropriate to age and ability

- promote a healthy lifestyle for each pupil, which could involve liaison with external agencies

Pupils

will aim to:

- attend school regularly and be punctual
- bring all equipment needed every day
- try their best at all times
- complete all independent learning tasks set and meet deadlines
- be polite and show consideration for others and their property
- uphold the school behaviour policy
- follow the school dress code
- follow the ICT acceptable use agreement
- record their own attendance, AtL and achievement and set targets for improvement
- share any concerns over work, friendships and safety with a parent or member of staff
- help keep the school environment clean and tidy and help to recycle, reduce and reuse resources

Parents

will aim to:

- ensure their daughter attends regularly and is punctual
- avoid making arrangements that would prevent their daughter from attending school
- ensure their daughter brings appropriate equipment to school necessary for her lessons e.g. books, pen, pencil...
- encourage their daughter to complete work at home, providing a work area in which she can do so
- use the pupil diary to support their daughter's completion of independent learning tasks
- encourage their daughter to behave acceptably, respecting others right to learn and their property
- support the school when behaviour is inappropriate
- ensure their daughter follows the school dress code
- attend parents' evenings to discuss their daughter's progress with teachers
- let school know about their daughter's successes and achievements
- let the school know of any relevant concerns or problems
- encourage their daughter to have a healthy lifestyle
- ensure their daughter uses ICT safely and responsibly
- support the aims of the school
